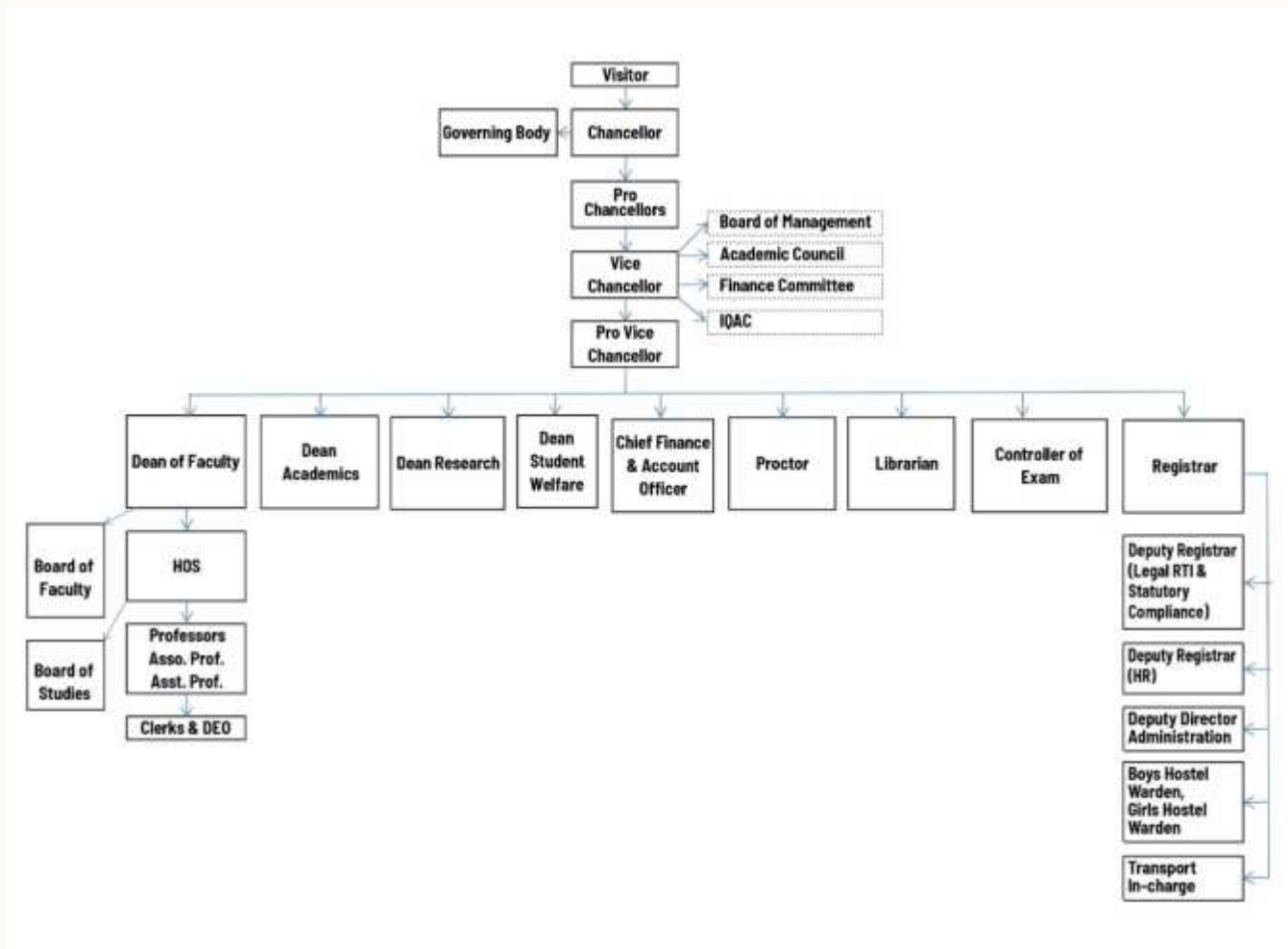

8. Academics and Research

A. Academic Initiatives

Geeta University has taken various steps for the academic development of students as follows:

NEP Implementation

The University has been aligned with the National Education Policy 2020 from its inception and has implemented all facets of it. Efforts have been made to enrich the implementation of detailed guidelines as a continuous process for the improvement of students' learning outcomes.

Multidisciplinary and Holistic Education

1. Multidisciplinary education using CBCS model of Core Electives, Open Electives have been implemented w.e.f. Academic Year 2022-23 and in the academic year 2024-25 additional 14 number of open electives are offered along with the existing 27 number of open electives.
2. Implementation of Academic Bank of Credits w.e.f. Academic Year 2023-24.
3. Permission to pursue Two Academic Programs simultaneously shall be implemented w.e.f. Academic Year 2025-26

Digital Empowerment and Online Education

Credit Transfer/Mobility Policy of Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) has been implemented *with effect from* Academic Year 2023-24. In Academic Year 2024-25, *35 courses* were mapped through the MOOC platforms (SWAYAM/NPTEL), and credits *were* transferred.

Skill Development and Employability

1. Internship Embedded Degree Programs has been implemented *with effect from* Academic Year 2022-23. In the academic year 2024-25, a total of *842 students* completed the credit-based internships.
2. Certification through six Industry Partners has been implemented *with effect from* Academic Year 2022-23. In the academic year 2024-25, a total of *208 industry certifications* were attained by the students.
3. Credits for Vocational Skills has been implemented *with effect from* Academic Year 2022-23 through the mandatory vocational skill baskets, i.e., Digital Marketing, Data Visualization,



Entrepreneurship, and Family Business. In the academic year 2024–25, another basket, “*Data Analytics using Python*,” was also offered.

8. Idea Lab has been *in place* since 2023–24. The lab invites innovative ideas from students regularly, *mentors* them to refine and convert them into startups.
